No Racial Bias Found In Carrier Incidents

A study by the Federal Bureau of Investigation today found no evidence of racial bias in the handling of carrier incidents involving the U.S. Navy.

The study, which was conducted by the FBI's Civil Rights Division, looked at 100 carrier incidents that occurred between 1968 and 1971.
