SECRETARY REPORTS State Court Rescinds Adoption Of Juvenile Court Procedure Code

The Indiana Supreme Court today rescinded its decision last week that the state's juvenile court procedure code was unconstitutional. Washington (AP) — President Nixon announced today that a cease-fire would be announced by the United States and North Vietnam on Saturday. The cease-fire would free 587 American prisoners of war.
